

Valéria Csépe is an internationally renowned psychologist and neuroscientist, with extensive experience in research (language, music, classical and digital literacy, typical and atypical cognitive development), higher education, and science policy. She is full member of the Hungarian Academy of Sciences, member of the Academia Europaea. She served as deputy secretary general of the Academy (2008–2014, the first female of the elected CEOs) and as president of the Hungarian Accreditation Committee (MAB) for two terms (2016–2025), during which she played a key role in strengthening the quality assurance system of the Hungarian higher education and its international engagement.



Valéria Csépe is a research professor emeritus of the RCNS Brain Imaging Centre, professor emeritus of the University of Pannonia. She is a highly cited researcher, mentor and supervisor of many early-stage researchers.
